Dear Members of the Board.

At the April 25 Board of Trustees' Meeting, we will request your approval on two consent agenda items for the procurement of services which include:

- Joint Trench Gas and Electric Service Installation (3-year commitment at \$40 EM) and
- New Electric and Gas Infrastructure Installation Services (3-year commitment at \$81M).

These services are essential to the continued effort of new installations and the maintenance of existing underground electrical infrastructure systems for subdivisions and apartment complexes.

## **EPA MODERATE OZONE NONATTAINMENT**

 In September 2018, Bexar County was designated as Marginal ozone nonattainment.



- September 2021 was Bexar County's deadline to reach attainment (failed to meet).
- On April 13, 2022, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed reclassifying Bexar County from Marginal to Moderate.\*
  - Moderate reclassification proposes:
    - Mandatory vehicle emission inspection & maintenance;
    - Stricter air permitting requirements; &
    - Additional emission control technologies.
- To help reduce ozone-forming emissions we are:
  - Partnering with Quidnet for long duration energy storage projects;
  - Increasing our EV fleet; &
  - Increasing our renewable energy portfolio under the FlexPOWER Bundle.
