OVERVIEW



- Key decisions are needed to serve our customers with adequate power generation as demand increases and aging power plants are set to retire
- Working with Rate Advisory Committee (RAC) last eighteen months to educate, inform and align on objectives for evaluation
- Charles River Associates (CRA) is providing modeling and analysis
- Burns & McDonnell is supporting the RAC with a peer review

Focused on an open & transparent process to guide power generation planning decisions between now and 2030.

MODELING APPROACH FORECASTING SOLUTIONS TO INFORM DECISIONS

Portfolios	Nine Distinct Concepts A combination of electric resource decisions made by CPS Energy (type of generation, retirement dates)
Scenarios	Four ERCOT Market Perspectives A future external state-of-the-world independent of CPS Energy resource decisions (gas & carbon prices, technology costs, demand, ERCOT market design)
Sensitivities	Four Variations A test stressing a single variable to determine its impact (extreme weather, enhanced STEP, reduced STEP, build v. buy)
Scorecard	Evaluation How portfolios performed in a given situation based on objectives (Reliability, Affordability, Sustainability, System Flexibility & Workforce Impact)

Modeling helps forecast potential outcomes to inform the Board's decision; it does not produce one "best" solution.


